OH DEAR! DROP EVERYTHING AND READ

As part of our curriculum we have highlighted that reading is at the centre of our students' academic success. Most of us read without even thinking about it. It's a skill we take for granted, yet one that is essential for being able to get on in life. As a child grows up, being able to read well not only enables them to discover new facts and to learn here at school, but essentially opens them up to a world of new ideas, stories and opportunities.

Reading enables children to acquire the information and skills they need in life, such as:

- * The relationship between sound and print, and knowledge of printed letters and words
- * Familiarity with a variety of writing styles
- * Vocabulary development
- * The difference between written language and everyday conversation
- * Development of language skills
- * The ability to learn from others, whether reading fiction or nonfiction

Here at Al Shohub Private School, we are launching a new reading initiative, that will involve our whole school community.

'Oh Dear'- Drop Everything And Read!

A weekly 'Oh DEAR' programme (Drop Everything and Read) provides students and staff with much more than a just-sit-there-and-read experience. Even more importantly, it gives students time to read what they want to read, share what they've read, and receive the support they need for further reading explorations and reflections. Weekly reading sessions last for 15 minutes and are followed by 5 to 7 minutes in which students can write in their reading response logs. Depending on the teachers' preference she can choose to set it as homework as well.

So if you are coming into school please make sure you have a reading book to hand!


